Course Introduction

The course also addresses emerging themes such as AI-enabled ESG data management, digital sustainability reporting, climate scenario analysis, sustainable finance, greenwashing risk, nature and biodiversity reporting, ESG assurance, and value-chain transparency. Recent global reporting developments show growing convergence around ISSB-aligned disclosure while ESRS implementation continues to mature, making strong ESG data governance and reporting capability increasingly valuable.

8. Navigate CSRD and ESRS concepts and evolving sustainability-reporting requirements.
9. Develop meaningful ESG KPIs, sustainability metrics, targets, and dashboards.
10. Apply climate-risk assessment, scenario analysis, and transition-planning techniques.
11. Strengthen ESG data governance, controls, traceability, and reporting assurance.
12. Identify greenwashing, data-quality, compliance, and reputational risks.
13. Build an integrated renewable-energy and ESG reporting roadmap supported by practical case studies.
